## Clubs

- Join a group of interest
  - Laurier club information and clubs list
- What should I do once I'm in the club?

- <u>ISWEP</u> (International Student Work Experience Program)
- <u>Indeed</u> job search engine

- Networking: LinkedIn and events/panels and employment information sessions

- Review the information slides from last year
- Go to an information session in your first year! (they start in January)
- Apply at the beginning of second year
