#### LEAVE AN OUTSTANDING IMPRESSION.

Treat your volunteer position just as you would treat a paid position. Be punctual, professional, attentive and collegial. Look for opportunities to take on leadership roles and to learn from those with more experience.

#### PRACTICE REFLECTION.

Be observant of your surroundings, ask questions and pay attention to the broad systemic issues that impact organizations and their service users. This can make your involvement a profoundly meaningful learning experience.
